

Demerit Points Factsheet

(December 2010)

What are demerit points and when can I get them?

Demerit points are a type of penalty imposed on your permit or licence when you commit certain traffic offences.

Demerit points range from 1 to 10 points per offence. For information on demerit point offences and how many demerit points apply to each offence, see the [VicRoads website](#).

If you commit a demerit point offence, Civic Compliance will send you a penalty notice which tells you the details of the offence and the amount of the fine.

You then have the following options:

- You can pay the fine or ask Civic Compliance for extra time to pay the fine
- You can ignore/not pay the fine – it will move to the Infringements' Court
- You can contest the fine and have your matter heard by the Magistrates' Court
- If you suffer from mental illness, intellectual disability, substance addiction or if you were homeless when you got the fine, you may be able to make a Special Circumstances application to revoke your fines – See our *“Dealing with Fines” Factsheet* or contact *Youthlaw* for more info.

How do I know how many demerit points are on my licence?


You can check demerit points on your licence by calling Vic Roads on 13 11 71.

When demerit points are applied, VicRoads will send you a letter which tells you how many demerit points you have incurred. The letter may also include an “option notice”.

What is an “option notice”?

VicRoads will send you an “option notice” if:

- You get **12 or more** demerit points **in any 3 year period**, OR
- You get **5 or more** demerit points **in any 12 month period** and you have a Learners permit or a Probationary licence.



You then have two options:

Option 1 – Suspend your licence/permit

You can choose to suspend your licence/permit for the time specified on the option notice. This means that you will not be able to drive a vehicle whilst your licence is suspended.

Option 2 – Keep your licence/permit

You can choose to keep your licence. But if you get any more demerit points in the next 12 months, your licence/permit will be suspended for **double the time** that it would have been suspended under option 1.
