I didn't realise I had forgotten to touch on until later when I tried to touch off and the Public Transport Authorised Officers came and talked to me.

I understand that I have done the wrong thing and accept responsibility for the infringement offence. I use Myki all the time and I usually remember to touch on. I ask you to withdraw the fine because of exceptional circumstances relating to this fine.

I am 18 years old and studying full-time at South Brunswick High School. I am in year 12. I live with my mum and I work at a fish and chip shop. I am only paid \$60 a week but I use this money to top up my Myki each week and to pay for my lunch. I can't take on any more shifts at work because I have my VCE exams coming up and I need the time to study. I just had glandular fever so I am behind with my classes. If I could afford it, I would pay this fine.

This is the first fine I have received and I respectfully request that my fine be reviewed and an official warning issued in its place.

Please notify me if you intend to refuse this application and refer the matter to court so that I can withdraw this application.
