DISCRIMINATION

Discrimination is when you are treated unfairly or less favourably than other people because of certain personal characteristics called "protected characteristics".

Protected Characteristics

Protected characteristics are:

- Age;
- Breastfeeding;
- gender identity;
- disability ;
- employment activity;
- industrial activity;
- lawful sexual activity;

- marital status;
- status as a parent or carer;
- physical features;
- pregnancy;
- race;
- sex;
- sexual orientation;
- political or religious beliefs or activities;
- an expunged homosexual conviction; and
- personal association with anyone who has any of these characteristics.

Sexual harassment is a form of discrimination.

There are laws against discrimination.
